

SACAJAWEA DRESS POLICY

TOPS – SOLID NAVY, WHITE OR BLACK

NO EMBLEM, LOGO, OR WRITING ON ANY TOP OTHER THAN SAC SWEATSHIRTS
Tops must be tucked in and stay tucked in when sitting down. Tops may not be worn half on and half off. Coats are worn outdoors only, not in the classroom or building.

- A. Polo style** (long or short sleeve, no cap sleeve) in navy, white, or black
MUST BE TUCKED IN AT THE WAIST AND BUTTONED WITHIN 2 BUTTONS OF NECK
1. If wearing a T-shirt under a top, it must be plain white without any writing on the T-shirt
 2. NO short sleeve polo shirt worn over a long sleeve T-shirt, no see-through or tight tops
- B. Turtlenecks** – white only worn under crewneck sweatshirt
- C. Cardigan sweaters** – navy blue, black, white
- D. Sweatshirts** – **the only sweatshirts allowed in class are SAC sweatshirts**
1. MUST WEAR POLO SHIRT UNDERNEATH THE SWEATSHIRT
 2. Crewneck sweatshirt with Sacajawea logo in navy, white or black
 3. 1/4 zip collared sweatshirt with Sacajawea logo in navy, black, or grey

BOTTOMS – SOLID TAN OR KHAKI, NAVY, BLACK

- A. Pants – Tan, Khaki, Navy Blue, or Black**
1. Tan (Dockers style) cotton, cotton blend. No denim fabric; no corduroys or cargo pants
 2. Worn at the waist
 3. Hemmed, NO frayed or torn items
 4. Must be belted if there are belt loops
 5. Length – at the top of the shoe, NOT dragging on the floor
 6. NO more than one size larger than the waist
 7. NO labels, NO adornments, including seams with stripes, multi-colored stripes, or cord-laced pants
 8. NO stretch pants, overalls, sweatpants, stirrup pants, spandex, nylon parachute pants, cargo pants, zip-off pant legs or painter style pants
 9. NO tight stretch fabric
 10. NO Dickie pants whatsoever.
- B. Skirts – Tan, Khaki, Navy Blue, or Black**
1. Worn at the waist
 2. Must be belted if there are belt loops
 3. Pleated, A-line, straight, gored, or gather styled skirts
 4. Length – NO SHORTER THAN 3" ABOVE THE KNEE
- C. Shorts – Tan, Khaki, Navy Blue, or Black**
1. Walking style only
 2. No more than one size larger than the waist
 3. Worn at the waist
 4. Hemmed
 5. Must be belted if there are belt loops
 6. Length – NO SHORTER THAN 3" ABOVE THE KNEE

SHOES, SOCKS, ACCESSORIES

A. Shoes

1. Athletic or tennis shoes
2. Leather type shoes
3. All sandals must have a heel strap for safety reasons
4. Shoe laces must be matched and tied
5. Both shoes must match each other
6. NO flip flops, soccer sandals, slippers, or high heels (must less than 2")

B. Socks

1. Socks are to be solid white, navy blue, khaki, brown, or black
2. Girls may wear skin-tone pantyhose
3. Girls tights or knee-highs can be solid white, navy blue, khaki, brown, or black

C. Belts

1. Belts must fit and the end of the belt can only be three inches beyond the buckle.
2. Belts must be worn with bottoms that have belt loops
3. No spiked, sharp edged items on the belts, printing on belts

D. Jewelry

1. NO nose/eyebrow/lip/tongue jewelry be to worn on campus
2. NO spiked or sharp edged items
3. NO sweat bands
4. NO large chains allowed worn around the neck, wrist, waist or hooked to wallets or keys
5. All jewelry must be UNDER clothing
6. No more than 3 bracelets per arm.

E. Hat/Head coverings - NO hats, hoods, bandannas, sweat bands, caps, beret, doo rags or any other covering of the head

F. Gloves

1. Gloves must match each other – both gloves or none!
2. Gloves may NOT be worn indoors

G. Ties - Must be school appropriate and worn with a Navy Blue, Black, or White dress shirt (not a polo). Must be properly tied and worn.

H. Chains - Not allowed hooked to wallets, belts or keys

I. Hair -Coloring that is excessive/extreme is not acceptable. Hairstyles that are excessive/extreme are not acceptable.

J. Scarves - Only worn outdoors

UNACCEPTABLE CLOTHING AND ACCESSORIES

- A. Oversized clothing
- B. Hats, caps, berets, doo rags, bandannas
- C. Chains hooked to wallets, belt, keys, etc.
- D. DENIM of any color or denim-looking material, corduroy
- E. Stretch pants, overalls, sweatpants, stirrup pants, spandex, nylon parachute pants, cargo pants, zip-off pant legs or painter style pants
- F. Scarves worn indoors
- G. Tight or revealing clothing that may expose the bare torso or undergarments

- H. Tops too tight or too short; tops that you can see through
- I. Jackets or coats worn in the classroom or the building during the school day
- J. Logos, emblems, or labels on clothing
- K. Writing on the student's body or any items of clothing
- L. Excessive makeup (no black lipstick, no thick black eye makeup)
- M. Wristbands
