Dress and Electronic Device Expectations

2019-2020

These policies apply to the school day, school events and Extended Learning

EXPECTATIONS FOR SCHOLAR DRESS:

Students have the right to express themselves through clothing and attire, and school staff has the responsibility to preserve and promote an educational setting. School personnel may ask scholars to change or cover-up clothing that substantially disrupts the educational environment; that poses a safety risk to the scholar or others; that is obscene, profane, or vulgar; or that promotes illegal conduct or conduct not allowed at school. Scholars are required to comply with any school specific rules related to dress, including uniform requirements. **FWPS District Policy 3224**

- **Monday through Friday**, TAF@Saghalie students may wear appropriately fitting jeans, pants, or shorts and an appropriately fitting shirt or sweatshirt.
- Jeans or pants may have visible distressed marks or small rips/tears. However, jeans or pants with large tears and/or exposed skin above the mid-thigh are not permitted.
- On **Thursday**, TAF@Saghalie will encourage students to **Dress for Success**; **ALL** students should dress for an interview or wear college gear.

Requirements:

Tops:

- All shirts, T-Shirts and sweatshirts must be school appropriate. No inappropriate writing, graphics or symbols.
- Low cut tops, tank tops, spaghetti straps, sleepwear, or mid-drift shirts are **NOT** appropriate school dress.

Bottoms:

- All bottoms must be worn at the waist and may not be sagging.
- **No** pajama bottoms
- Skirts and shorts must be an appropriate length for school.

Shoes and Accessories:

- **No slippers or blankets.**

PE Uniforms:

- Students must dress for PE and will receive one PE shirt from the school.
- Grey T-shirts, black athletic shorts, and gym shoes are required attire.

Head Gear:

- Unless for religious purposes or extenuating circumstances (**with administrative approval**), no head coverings (including - but not limited to - caps, stocking caps, hats, sun visors, hoodies, do-rags or bandanas).

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Electronic Resources

In recognition of parent/guardian decisions regarding the safety and communication needs of their families, we have outlined expectations regarding the use of electronics. These expectations are in place so that we can create a positive and productive learning environment. **The possession and use of personal and school electronic or telecommunications devices** (including - but not limited to - phones, tablets, iPods/iPads, watches, pens, and recording devices), **must NOT pose a threat to academic integrity, disrupt the learning environment or violate the privacy rights of** others and should only be used with permission from their instructor. ***FWPS District Policy 3245***

In using the district digital resources, scholars accept the responsibility to:

- Use the digital resources for educational purposes only.
- Follow district/building policies and federal/state laws, including copyright laws and privacy laws.
- Follow district rules and expectations on use of the network and the internet.
- Use good behavior.
- Respect district property and services provided.
- Use digital resources in an educational, legal, moral, and ethical manner.
- Use only their personal information to login on devices and not to share passcodes or credentials to district services.
- Respect the security measures in place and follow guidelines.
- Send, access, and publish school-appropriate materials only.

Requirements:

- Ear buds and headphones may be worn with teacher permission **during independent work time only**.
 - **An Administrator must approve special circumstances.**
 - Ear buds and headphones must be out of sight when not in use.
- Use of cell phones and other electronic devices is allowed before school, during lunch, or after school.
- Teachers may grant permission to use electronic devices if intended for academic purposes.
