



30 Million Word Gap

DID YOU KNOW?

- By the age of 3, a 30-million word gap exists between children of the lowest Socioeconomic Status (SES) families and those of the highest SES families.¹

HOW YOU CAN HELP

- Read aloud to your children for 15 minutes a day from birth to grade three.
- By the age of 3, a child should be able to
 - speak with 90 percent of his or her words being understandable;
 - begin copying letters of the alphabet;
 - count from 1 to 10 correctly using objects;
 - recognize and name five shapes; and
 - pretend and make up stories with toys and household items.²
