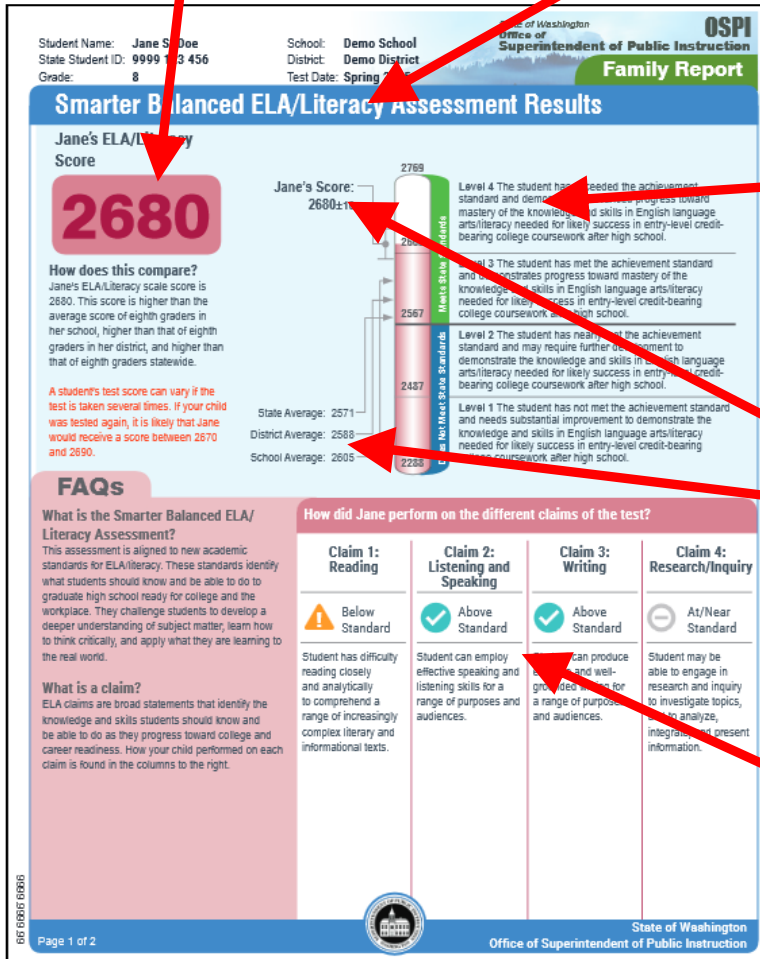


How to Read Your Child's Score Report

Each year, students in the Federal Way Public Schools take one or more standardized test to measure progress toward state standards. This document explains the common parts of various score reports issued by the State of Washington. This document uses a Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) Score report as an example, but this guide can also be used for the MSP and HSPE report.

The SCALE SCORE is determined from how many points your child earned on the test. These scores are determined by the test maker.

The name of the test is indicated at the top. The information in the report is only related to this test. The test(s) taken by your child depends upon his or her grade level.



The PERFORMANCE LEVEL is based upon how a student performs on a test. There are 4 possible levels with a description for each level. The State of Washington approves the performance levels for a scale score.

You can view here how your child scored compared to the state, district and school averages.

This portion of the report explains how your child did on different parts of the test. The report tells how your child performed for each part and if he or she met the standard in each area.
