JANUARY DEADLINES

DAUNA LEIGH BAUER SCHOLARSHIP-GONZAGA UNIVERSITY: This scholarship is for students applying to Gonzaga University. The Dauna Leigh Bauer Scholarship was established for students with a 3.75 GPA, SAT of at least 1310 or ACT of 28. Students must complete the admission application and financial aid requirements by December 1, 2020. Please see www.gonzaga.edu/scholarships.
